## Introduction

Powder Horn is a training opportunity designed to expose the Venturing or Boy Scout leader to activities and resources necessary to operate a successful high adventure program in several ways:

- ❖ Help Venturing and Boy Scout leaders to safely conduct outdoor activities of a fun and challenging nature.
- ❖ Provide an introduction to the resources necessary to successfully lead their Venturers and older Boy Scouts through a program of high adventure.
- ❖ Familiarize the Advisor with the Ranger program so that he or she can help the Venturer meet the requirements of the Ranger Award.

This course is based on the Ranger Award requirements giving participants an exposure to outdoor/high adventure activities.

The course will include the following Ranger Award Core Requirements and many of the Electives: First Aid; Communications; Cooking; Emergency Preparedness; Land Navigation; Leave No Trace; Wilderness Survival; Conservation; Backpacking; Cave Exploring; Cycling/Mountain Biking; Ecology; Equestrian;

### What is Wood Badge?

Wood Badge is the premier adult leadership training program for the Boy Scouts of America. It teaches contemporary leadership and team development skills in an outdoor setting.

### What's in it for me?

He raised to his lips the horn of a Greater Kudu, one of the largest of African antelopes. He blew a long sharp blast. Nineteen men dressed in short pants and knee socks, their sleeves rolled up, assembled by patrols for the first Scoutmasters' training camp held at Gilwell.

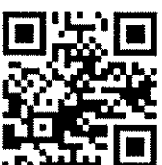

**Course Prerequisites:**

Wood Badge for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century is open to ALL registered adult leaders who have completed the basic training requirement for their primary position. Scoutmaster, Assistant Scoutmasters, Varsity Coaches and Assistants must complete Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills in addition to the above requirements. Outdoor training is not required of other leaders but it is highly recommended. Additional training details can be obtained from your District training Team.

**Outdoor Skills:**

Since overnight camping and outdoor cooking will be part of this course, some basic camping skills will be helpful but not essential. Both the staff and experienced participants will help participants new to the outdoors have a safe and enjoyable Wood Badge experience.

**Advance Preparation:**

Prior to Wood Badge training at McGimsey Scout Park, participants will receive a packet containing details that will help them prepare for the course. Remember, all participants are to wear the full Scout uniform for their position during the course. **This is the BSA standard uniform, not the unit approved uniform.**

**Health and Safety:**

The Wood Badge training team adheres to the Guide to Safe Scouting. Each participant must have a current medical form (parts a&b) before they can attend Wood Badge. And they must be capable of functioning safely in an outdoor environment. There will be a staff medical officer who will administer first aid and assist with any health issues that may arise.

**Refunds will be given for medical**

**Reasons only.**

Requests need to be submitted in writing no later than 14 days after the start of the course. All refunds will be debited a \$10.00 readiness fee.

**Cost:**

The fee for the Wood Badge courses is \$180. A \$90 deposit is required to hold your reservation. This fee covers all instructional materials and food. Each participant will also receive a course hat and cup. Monetary issues should never prevent anyone from attending. Alamo Area Council does provide partial scholarships for those who qualify and apply. Write a letter or e-mail to Jim Matthews (Wood Badge Staff Advisor) describing the circumstances which might prevent you from attending the Wood Badge Course. A letter can be attached to the application.

This course is first come, first served, so make your reservations as soon as possible. To hold the course, at least 30 participants must be fully paid 30 days prior to the start of the course.

CPR/AED: February 10, 2012

WILDERNESS and REMOTE FIRST AID: February 17 & 18, 2012

**WILDERNESS AND REMOTE FIRST AID PREREQUISITE:** Proof of Current Adult CPR/AED. Must be 16 yr. + to participate.

**SCHEDULE: CPR/AED ADULT:** Check in starts at 5:30 p.m. Friday, February 10<sup>th</sup> in the McGimsey House. Class begins at 6 p.m. and runs late on Friday night. Those who complete this will receive the ARC CPR/AED Adult certification, valid for 2 years.

**WILDERNESS AND REMOTE FIRST AID:** Check in starts at 5:30 p.m. Friday, February 17<sup>th</sup> in the McGimsey House. Class begins promptly at 6 p.m. and will run late on Friday night. The Course will continue promptly at 8:00 am on Saturday morning with a break for lunch at noon then continues until complete. Friday supper, Saturday breakfast and Saturday lunch will be provided by the Council.

**DESCRIPTION:** The American Red Cross (ARC) developed the 16 hour Wilderness and Remote First Aid training to meet the needs of the Boy Scouts of America in situations where emergency response is over 30 minutes. This course combines class lecture, skills practice and realistic scenarios to teach assessment, basic and advanced first aid techniques, extended care, transports and evacuations, and dealing with emotionally upset patients. Basic first aid skills are covered making this course appropriate for anyone regardless of experience level. Those who successfully complete this will receive the ARC "Wilderness and Remote First Aid" certificate which is valid for 2 years. A minimum age of 16 is recommended for participants due to the serious nature of the course and scenarios.

**REGISTRATION AND FEES:**

**CPR/AED ADULT:** Registration must be received at Council office by 5:00 pm February 3. Cost for CPR/AED ADULT certification is \$30. Minimum class size is 6. Cost includes materials.

**WILDERNESS and REMOTE FIRST AID:** Registration must be received at Council office by 5:00 pm February 10<sup>th</sup>. Cost for Wilderness and Remote First Aid certification is \$100. Cost includes meals and materials. Minimum class size is 6.

Please register early as **SPACE IS LIMITED TO THE FIRST 15 PEOPLE**. You are not on the list until your payment and registration form are accepted at the Scout Office.
